PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Colleagues and WPATH Members,

On behalf of the WPATH Board of Directors, it is my distinct pleasure to welcome you to our 24th Biennial Scientific Symposium, held this year in amazing Amsterdam. I am also pleased to tell you that this is the largest international meeting WPATH has ever convened, and I hope that our Symposia will grow even larger in the future.

You are part of a very sudden (though it was a long time coming!) explosion of interest in Transgender experience, health, and rights. I wish I could say all of this interest was due to WPATH's efforts, but that is not entirely the case: We have been as pleasantly surprised as everyone else who is active in this field. The truth is, while most of us were pursuing our ongoing work with our clients, patients, and constituencies, the long-standing efforts of many of our members to change policies and practices worldwide, and our partnerships with numerous transgender community-based organizations to provide medical and mental health expertise to substantiate their efforts, have combined with a media awakening that has put transgender people and issues in the spotlight like never before.

Just a few years ago, when the local organizing committee members and our staff and volunteers began planning this Symposium, the prevailing wisdom was that we should plan for roughly 400-500 participants. Prior to our 2014 meeting in Bangkok, where we had 525 participants, the standard projection was 350-450. And there were some on the 2016 planning team who worried that even to expect 500 would be a risk: What if we could not make our hotel room commitment? What if we could not recoup the cost of the conference through the registration fees? Planning for a smaller conference minimizes those risks. And Amsterdam is not a city with spacious convention facilities, so we thought we'd be pretty safe with a conservative number. Instead, though, we have an embarrassment of riches, with nearly 800 participants registered as I write this, a few weeks in advance.

WPATH's staff, our Board, and the dedicated members of the local organizing committee are thrilled to have so many of you joining us this year. Our Scientific Committee has worked diligently to create a stellar program for you; our staff has worked very hard to keep everything running smoothly, and our local organizing team has also spent countless hours working to accommodate all of you in the limited spaces that were available to us.

So, again, WELCOME to Amsterdam. We trust you will be empowered by the evidence and expertise that will be shared here, as we begin a new era in the visibility and respect for transgender people and transgender health and rights. We hope you will have a fabulous time!

ACCREDITATION

NEEDS AND OBJECTIVES

WPATH is most known for publishing the Standards of Care for the Health of Transsexual, Transgender, and Gender Nonconforming People first published in 1979 and now in its 7th revision. As evidence based research, global policy and resources begin to expand it is now feasible for more trans* people to seek access to care. There is a sizable gap however, in the number of people who need care and the health care providers with the training to provide it. With this increased need there is an even larger desire for evidence based education and peer to peer networking among professionals serving the increasing number of trans* people seeking medical and mental health services globally.

Designed to advance the field and update participants with state-of-the-science knowledge related to the provision of care, advocacy for gender diverse individuals in research, clinical practice, and social policy. The WPATH Symposium is international in scope and interdisciplinary in focus allowing for the exchange of new scientific information among professionals interested in transgender health.

WPATH is seen as the leader in this field with the expertise to improve access to competent care and equitable treatment for transsexual, transgender, and gender non-confirming people. The objectives of the International Symposium as illustrated through abstracts, case studies and panel discussion are to:

- Explore comprehensive Ethical Guidelines concerning the care of patients with gender identity disorders.
- Explore current barriers to healthcare in underserved populations
- Discuss cultural considerations in the provision of gender-affirming care
- Obtain resources on legal and policy matters to assist in advocating for one's clients/patients
- Connect professionals in the field across disciplines and geography.
- Promote knowledge, sensitivity, cultural competence, and capability to provide relevant, informed care to transgender and gender non-conforming people.
- Provide a practice environment that accepts, treats with dignity and affirmed in the identities of trans* people.
- Explore the social and biological aspects of gender diversity
- Evaluate the latest evidence-based practices with transgender individuals who wish to transition socially or medically
- Describe current standards of care (e.g., hormonal and surgical treatment options),
- Determine mental health care considerations when working with adults as well as youth and adolescents.
- Examine psychotherapeutic practices with transsexual, transgender and gender-nonconforming clients

For the preconference day and the plenary day: 5.5 Hours of Accreditation has been requested from the Dutch Psychiatric Association.



APA-APPROVED CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS

The Society for the Psychological Study of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Issues, Division 44 of the American Psychological Association, to offer APA-approved Continuing Education (CE) credits for select educational programming. A number of sessions at the WPATH Biennial Symposium have been accredited for these credits. At this point, sessions in each of the time slots for the mini-symposium break-out session scheduled for Sunday, Monday and Tuesday of the Symposium have been accredited. As a result, it is possible to accumulate a maximum of 13.5 hours of credit during these three days.

CE credits are required of licensed mental healthcare providers in most states and provinces in the U.S. and Canada in order to maintain licensure. While similar credits may be required in other countries, attendees are strongly encouraged to first check with their licensure or certification board to ensure that APA-approved CE credits will be accepted in fulfillment of this requirement *before registering for these credits*. Registration for APA-approved CE credits requires a flat fee of \$50. Payment must be made in U.S. Dollars directly to Div. 44.

Earning credit for any given session requires full attendance at the session, signing in and out of the designated session, and completion of an on-line evaluation form for each session attended. Credit can therefore be granted for only one session per time-slot in the schedule.

GEI Elective credits available for select Mini-Symposia.

Our Global Education Initiative GEI courses are first and foremost about providing foundational training to as many providers as possible.

In the US and likely in other parts of the world, there are many new providers starting to provide treatment to transgender, transsexual and gender non-binary individuals and many are doing so with little to no experience with clients, or patients in these groups. Those who attend our training courses and have an interest in learning more may choose to become a member of WPATH and have the option to pursue certification.

The certification option is a WPATH membership benefit (not an outside credentialing process). It is meant only to recognize member providers who have taken steps to further their continuing education in a broad range of specific topics related to the WPATH Standards of Care 7. More about the details of the certification requirements and grandfathering can be found in our GEI News Special Supplement at wpath.org or by contacting donna@wpath.org.

This program is meant to enhance, not limit access to care in any way. Each WPATH member may determine if certification matters to them, some providers will see this as an advantage and other will not. That is perfectly fine. WPATH certification is meant to reward those who wish to complete the extensive training and feel it beneficial in their region and practice setting to signify to the community that they are a WPATH member, that they have been through a rigorous WPATH educational training curriculum and that they continue to stay on top of evidence in the field.

This option will be extended to all members regardless of where in the world they reside. The entire curriculum has not yet been completed. The global core competencies committee is currently working on defining the educational domains and competencies' that will have global consistency and that WPATH will utilize for our future trainings to be offered live and eventually online. The working group will be presenting an update on the core competencies at this conference on Monday at 4:45 pm.

If you wish to pursue certification, please note that any of the mini symposia offered here in Amsterdam may be counted toward your elective credits.
